The Board considered the Review Summary for the month of June, 1979 included in the agenda circulated vide Coord: Section's memo: No.CDA_630/BM_Coord/79 dated the 22nd July, 1979 and took the following decisions:-

PRESIDENT'S HOUSE.

to the Chairman by the Dy: Director General Works. Physical progress achieved on various on going works was also explained. Considering the progress of work being un-satisfactory, Chairman enquired whether (Some Dan) progress was being watched by the executing agencies at site through the C.P.M. Chart. He emphasised the need for maintaining progress/C.P.M. Charts on every on-going project, alongwith the cash flow statement, so that the quantum of work done by the contractors vis-a-vis the payments made to them and the progress achieved against the pre-set targets are known to the executing agencies. The Chairman expressed his dis#approbation of the laissez-faire type approach of the controlling engineering staff towards the contractors and observed that there was no coordination at the supervisory tier level. $H_{f e}$ further directed that expected delay in critical jobs should be pointed out to the Board. The 10th August, 1979 was given as the target date for thecompletion of work of Presidency. He remarked that immediate approach to the Presidency presented a drab look and it should be further beautified. Chairman desired that a comprehensive paper on the Project should be prepared by the Dy: Director General Works and put up to him expeditiously.

CONSTRUCTION OF 1840 'A' TO 'D' 2.

Director Works explained that due to short supply of cement, progress of work on the project had suffered. He stated that the position of cement is expected to improve and efforts shall be made to step up the pace of work provided regular supply of requisite quantity of cement is ensured. Chairman enquired about the reasons for short sumply of cement. The position with regard to the manner in which cement was procured by the Authority and the bottlenecks which the Authority had to face in getting required quantity of cement for its on going projects were explained to the Chairman by FA/Member in detail. Director P&S explained that due to transportation . difficulties the Pakistan State Cement Corporation

directed Director Roads to improve the quality of performance.

6. SEWERAGE TREATMENT PLANT(PHASE_III).

The back-ground and the progress of work at site was explained by Director W & S. Chairman enquired whether a study had been carried out by the Authority for utilization of water from the Sewerage Treatment Plant. He further enquired whether any attempt was made to produce electricity with the gas from the Sewerage Treatment Plant, Director W & S explained that in-so-far as utilization of water from the Sewerage Treatment Plant is concerned a study was carried out in the past but the proposal was not found feasible. As regards the production of electricity with the gas from the Sewerage Treatment Plant, Director Maintenance stated that no such attempt was made by the Authority in this behalf although provision for this was made in the original plans. Chairman desired that study on both the issues should be carried out by Director W & S and Director Maintenance respectively. and reports put up to him for consideration.

7. <u>CONSTRUCTION OF MOSQUES.</u>

The factors taken into consideration in determining the number and category of mosques provided in various sectors of Islamabad were explained by Director Planning. Chairman enquired whether any follow up study was carried out by the Planning Directorate to ensure whether or not the mosques already provided were sufficient to meet the requirements of the residents of the area. Director Planning explained that no such study was varried out: He, however, stated that by and large mosques already provided in various sectors were sufficient to cope with the requirement except for congregational prayers such as Juma and Eid prayers.

Chairman, however, desired that a proper followup study should be got carried out so that the benefit of such study could be made use of in the planning of mosques to be provided in the developing sectors.

FAILURES ON THE PART OF MUNICIPAL ADMINISTRATION DIRECTORATE.

Chairman observed that most of the criticism from the general public against CDA was due to the failures of the Municipal Administration Directorate in the performance of their duties relating to sanitation and up-keep of Islamabad. He said that there was need for re-organizing the sanitation wing of the Municipal Admn: Directorate so as to improve its working efficiency especially at the lower tiers. He desired that an O & M study of the Municipal Administration Directorate should be carried out by the DD (O&M) and a report containing his recommendations as to how this organization could be made efficient should be put up to the Board for consideration. Chairman also directed the Director Municipal Administration to put up proposals for the introduction of mechanised sanitation system in Islamabad. He observed that a stage has
