I. Site for Petrol Fumps in Islamabad.

The summary presented by the Directorate Flaming on the location of petrol pumps in Islamabad along the lational Highway was considered. After the discussions that followed, Director Flaming was requested to make a reference to the Central Government on the location of petrol pumps on the basis of "Cluster Principle". Such a

reference, however, should be made only after the Board has viewed it and accorded its approval. In annexure 'A' the petrol pumps listed at items 2 & 5 were approved subject to their conformity to the standard specifications. Fetrol pump listed at item 7 was rejected by the Board, being too close to a crossing and dangerous from the traffic point of view.

II. Removal of private houses in Bokra area in Sector I-10, Islamabad.

The Board reviewed the summary presented by the Additional Director Rehabilitation on the captioned subject and inter-alia decided that the Additional Director Lands, Ch. Azam, be permitted to examine cases where built up property has been excluded from payment of compensation, and the land on which such structure stood has been acquired. It was brought to the notice of the Board that Commissioner, Ch. had invariably accepted appeals in such matters on the pleas that it was un-thinkable to acquire the land ignoring the structure that stood there on. Since the Commissioner is already doing it, the Additional Director Lands was permitted to follow a similar approach. This was also considered necessary in view of the current situation prevailing in the country and to avoid all possible annoyance and discomfort to the public.

Items appearing at (a) & (b) in para 9 of the summary were agreed to by the Board and regarding item (d), the Board decided that a reference may be made to the Central Government.

III. Review of Progress of Works

The Board also reviewed the monthly progress of works.

IV. Regulations for allotment of residential plots in Islamabad.

The kegulations on the captioned subject prepared by the state Officer were examined in detail. The Board suggested several amendments and alterations. The Estate Officer was requested to incorporate all the amendments and alterations suggested by the Board and bring up the regulations again for consideration of the Board.

V. Transfer of Islamabad Mosques Staff to Augaf Department.

The Secretary presented the file on the above subject and also showed a letter received recently from the Cabinet Division

on the 8th February, 1 %9 on the capcioned subject. The Secretary was directed to keep the Cabinet Division posted about the developments in this regard and also to send copy of a poster which some interested parties have circulated recently about the managements of moscues by the mucaf bepartas nt. nother copy of the same may be sent to the Chief administr tor / uoaf.

> Vi. office Building of Directorate General of Fost Offices.

Director Architecture explained the designs prepared by b/5. Nacvi Siddiqui, Lembers of the Board expressed the desire to avoid monotony in designs as far as possible at the same time it was also considered necessary to reduce maintenance cost to the maximum. Dr. Chohan, Director Corks suggested that because the expansion in these buildings in future was to be leaser and not vertical, therefore, the arrangement for providing lifts could be dispensed with. This was accepted by the Board and the Co nunication Secretary, Government of Takistan. It was also decided that the space for the lift wells as provided in the present design may be utilized for providing toilet facilities. It would have extra advantage of leaving some extra space retaining the basic character of the present design.
