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3) 46 1. WATER SUPPLY SITUATION IN ISLAMABAD.

The Board reviewed the Water situation in Islamabad before taking up the agenda. The continued scarcity of water was noted. Once again the Chairman emphasised the urgency of taking all suitable steps to improve the water situation as best as we could. The following decisions were taken:

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- i). A letter of thanks should be written to Islamabad Club for permitting us the use of their Golf Course Tubewell for drawing water for drinking purposes.
- ii). The Chairman apprised the Board that he had discussed the use of water from Kurang with Mr. Yamin Qureshi, Joint Secretary, Agriculture The Deputy Director Agriculture representing the Provincial Government was also at hand and he assured that till the rains came all water in Kurang would be made available for drinking purposes. The Board directed the drinking purposes. The Board directed the Secretary to follow up the matter with concerned agencies.
- iii). Every possible source for water should be tapped. No one should be allowed to loose any water from any of our sources for any purpose.
 - iv). Suitable schemes should be prepared to cater for the needs of Islamabad for the next four years for it was so likely that Simly Dam would be completed only after four years. In this regard a particular mention was made to tapping the upper reaches of River Soan.
 - v). The Government should be informed about water scarcity during summer since it was likely to be a permanent feature for quite some time to come. It was considered necessary to do so since it would help the Government in deciding details about the future of Simly Dam project.

- vi). WASID may be reminded to hurry up their investigation to have a tunewel investigations about sinking of tubewells.
- vii). We should use our own rigs as well for test boring to instal tubewells where er possible.
