Item No.I

Case No.974/151/66. Sub: GOVERNMENT HOSTEL

The Board considered the summary prepared by the D.G.W. and unanimously decided that the C.D.A. should only provide furniture, curtains and carpets in the rooms, whereas the contractor shall be responsible for providing towels, soap, bed linen (changeable), dining room equipments etc. and the service bearers. There shall, however, be a Comptroller appointed by the C.D.A. to collect the rent, maintain the accounts, and keep an eye on the running of the hostel. It was desired that revised rates to be charged by the contractor should now be worked out in the light of the present decision and submitted to the Board for approval before inviting tenders.

Item No.II

Case No.975/151/66. Sub: DEVELOPMENT OF SECTOR I-9.

The revised layout plan prepared by the Director of Planning for a portion of sector I-9 (I9-2 & I9-3) to be sold to private applicants for building small houses, was considered. It was desired that a copy of the plan should be supplied immediately to the D.G.W. for preparation of cost estimates for its development, and the plan should be re-submitted alongwith these estimates

nullah used to carry a very small quantity of water ordinarily, and none during the dry season. In view of the quantity of water available in that nullah in the present exceptionally dry seasons, the D.G.W. recommended that this source might as well be tapped to supplement the supply of water to Islamabad, and to meet the requirements of the Horticulture Directorate for the golf course. The Board after due consideration decided that D.G.W. should proceed to make water available from this - source in addition to the tapping of Gumrah and possibly also the Kurang River. Work on all these projects should start simultaneously.
