ITEM No. I.

1074/174/66.

Sub:- Comparative study for provision of terraced garden instead of lake in the Sectt. Zone.

The summary submitted by the D.G.W. was considered and the preliminary design of the terraced garden prepared by Mr. Heath examined. It was suggested that provision for a canal and water cascades running through the terraced garden should be made in the design.

It was desired that the water requirements of the terraced garden, which have not been shown in the summary, should be worked out by the Director of Horticulture to facilitate appraisal of the differential in the requirements of water for the lake and the terraced garden.

It was also desired that detailed estimates both for the development of the terraced garden & the lake should be prepared separately. Mr. Heath was, therefore, requested to give design details of the garden, necessary for the preparation of such estimates. In view of the proposed visit of Mr. E. Stone on 26.6.1966, Mr. Heath was asked to expedite the design details.

ITEM No. II.

1075/174/66.

Sub:- Preliminary plan of parks in F6-3.

The plan was presented by Mr. Heath and it was decided that the road which had been divided into two parts should run through as per original plan of the area. In order to achieve the desired objective a wooden bridge for pedestrian crossing may possibly be provided over this road. Regarding the proposed tower in the park area, the Chairman desired to visit the site himself to see whether or not it should be provided. Final decision in this respect would be taken subsequently.

ITEM No. III.

Sub:- Playing fields for the public school in G6-3.

The plan presented by Mr. Month was approved and it was decided that the Director of Horticulture should start grading etc. of the area immediately.

ITEM NO. IV.

Sub:- Planting programme for the monsoon (July, September, 1966).

The programme submitted by the Director of Horticulture was approved with the observations that, in view of the limited funds, expenditure on masonry works should be reduced as far as possible. This would release more funds for turfing and planting. Greater attention than hitherto should be paid to making the residual/built up areas green.

ITEM NO. V.

Sub:- Alternative designs for fire-headquarter at Islamabad.

Alternative elevations for the fire-headquarters submitted by the Architect Mr. Farooqi were considered and after detailed examination design No. 5 was approved. It was, however, desired that the design and dimensions of the tower should be revised and the Director of Municipal Administration should discuss this matter with the Architect.

ITEM NO. VI.

Sub:- Lease of Government Hostel, Islamabad.

After consideration of the summary the Board accepted the proposal of the D.G.W. and decided that the management of the hostel should remain with the CDA but a contract for catering be given to a suitable party. The terms of the contract should accordingly be revised and fresh applications invited from interested parties.
