Following decisions were taken :-

2294/4/3/7/1. Sports' Stadium in Ramna 7/4 Class IV Cencre.

Summary on the captioned item was presented by the Director Architecture, who explained the salient features of the proposed Di Act Stadium, in Class V Centre of Ramna 7 instead of Class IV Centre of the same Sector. The Board decided that the plan should be revised keeping in view the objects that play ground facilities are to be provided and neces ary spertenants to the play ground should be planned in the area. This would mean construction of a pavilian on one side with a place to sit at the top. Some stalls/shops for refreshments be provided. Indoor games may be provided/possible. The plan shall be revised by the Director Arch: and re-submitted to the Board, within two weeks.

a) Nullah Park in Shalimar 6/1

The design on the captioned item was presented by Mr. M.C. Pasha, Landscape Arch: He explained the solient features of land scaping of Nullah Park in Shalimar 6/1 & 6/2. The modern approved the I descaping design of the analysis.

b) Class III Centre in Shalimar 6/1.

The design was presented by Mr. Abdul Qadir, Landscape Arch:. He explained the salient features of the landscape plan for the Shopping Centre of Shalimar 6/1. It was observed that this item was earlier presented to the Board. The Board had desired that the cost of landscape of the area around the mosque and around the shopping centre should be separacely worked out. No such exercise, it appears, has been carried out. Nor survey has been done as was visualised earlier that keeping in view our social conditions what type of plant shall withstand the clemency of weather and niggardly attitude of people. The landscaping design still envisages extensive civil work which will entail considerable expenditure. The moard, therefore, decided that the design should be revised and resubmitted along with the estimates of lanuscaping.

c) Nullah in Shalimar u/1 to Shalimar 6/4.

The design was explained to the Board by Mr. Abdul Qadir, Landscape Arch. He explained that earlier the landscape design was prepared by a Japanese Arch: who besides retaining the Nullah, provided a number of facilities also. Since all these facilities fell into the bed of the Nullah, he examined the whole case again and found that if a small ei: near Nazimuddin Road is constructed, the nullah can se converted into a small lake which would be in harmony with the existing topography of the site. While discussing the item, it was found out that the nullah had a small catchment area. In fact it has its source in the adjacent sector and obviously the volume of Water would not be sufficient to convert the nullah into the lake. The Board, however, approved the item subject to its clearance by Director W & S, who would study the basic data regarding the discharge of the Water in the nullah.

d) Master Landscape Plan of Presidential Estate.

The design was presented to the Goard by Mr. George Loacker, Austrian Landscape Arch: He explained that the treatment will be done in 3 phases. Efforts have been made to eliminate civil work. The Board approved the broadoutlines of the landscaping plan of the Presidential Estate and desired to work out the details with costs.

1196/4/3/7/3. Design of National Library. 561/0F-Con4/15-71

Summary on the coptioned item was presonted by the Director Arch: It was explained that M/s. Robert Mathews & Partners who were designing the National Library building, have refused to undertake 2 Di Avch the designing work in case the building was not airconditioned. Director Arch: explained that the three buildings, i.e. National

Library, National Museum and National $\operatorname{Ar}_{\mathbb{C}}$ hives, were to be

designed by M/s. Robert Machews & Partners. From time to time the Design Committee and the Education Department gave various space requirements about the Library building. This resulted in the revision of the design prepared by M/s. Robert Mathew. Design Committee decided that the building should not be airconditioned and the Arch: was accordingly informed. However, Education Ministry thereafter informed the Arch: that although airconditioning will not be done, yet provision will have to be made for airconditioning in future. M/s. Robert Mathew thus undertook the designing of the Library building keeping in view these directions. He holds that as far as his work is concerned, it has not reduced because of airconditioning in future as the building is being designed as aircondicioned. The Board felt that the summary did not contain relevant facts. It is not known from the summary that what original requirements of the Education Ministry were indicated to the CDA and the Arch: regarding the designing of this building. At what stage those requirements were changed and by whom? Was the Design Committee fully informed of the possible repercussions when requirements were being changed? When the agreement had been signed between the CDA and the Arch: how the Education Ministry have been giving directions to the Arch: and to what extent the Arch: was required to follow those directions under the agreement? Director Arch: was requested to bring up the summary again with full facts.

Davelopment of Low-cost Housing in Islamabas.

3 DPL 4 D. Arch. 5 9 (164) (Add). Res 10 FW

The summary on the captioned item was presented to the Board by the Addl: Director Reh:. The Roard felt that there was no necessity of bringing up the summary at this stage as CDA is 2 Du AfA coordinating the efforts with a view to see the pilot project through and is not involved financially. What was required to be done was that the scheme was to be explained to the employees of the CDA regarding the size of plots, the cost of the land and the cost of the quarter and the mode of payment. Once there was a favourable response, the applications already received had to be processed and when the sample of the loar is required from House Building Finance Corporation, the twork was to be under-taken by the CDA as deposit work. If the experiment proved success, then alone a regular scheme will be drawn and extended to cover Central Government, employees as well as public at large. Obviously, therefore, there was nothing in the schere which needs approval of the Board.

Addl: Director Reh: desired that the cost of the land, the period of instalments and rate of inter st might be fixed by the woard. It was explained to the woard that the scattered plots are within the settled sectors of Ramna 7. The price per sq.yd. of the sector has already been approved by the Government. The woard, therefore, decided that the Government approved prices should be charged from the employees. It was further d cided that instead of recovering in lumpsum, the price shall be recovered from the employees in 5 years' easy instalments. The woard agreed to charge the normal rate of interest which is presently being charged by the COA on outstanding instalments.

In this context, the Board also discussed the progress of the low-cost housing scheme 'Humak' for the displaced persons. It was explained that the applicants have deposited 10% of the cost of the plots. 25% of the cost will be recovered at the time of handing over the possession. The Board felt that it would be advisable that plots are given to those displaced persons who are prepared to pay in lumpsum. This is essential because it would be difficult to make recovery of the outstanding instalments from the displaced persons once they are put in possession and allowed to construct houses on the plots for obvious reasons.
